

Listening tips

Facial Expressions
Tone of Voice

Movement

Appearance

Eye Contact

Gestures

Posture

Listening tips

 Non-verbal – facial expressions, body language (where are your hands/legs, etc), head movements

- Verbal sounds but not words
- "I am listening words"

Active listening

- Pay attention
- Look at the person
- Make sure they talk the most
- Listen to the feelings not just the words
- Silence is ok
- Ask a small number of open questions
- Repeat or paraphrase ?

Open questions

- How was that?
- How do you feel?
- What was that like?

Telling your story

- In pairs
- One incident from your time in child protection process
- Tell everyone what you have found out

Responsibilities

- Light Touch
- Listen to their story and fears Provide emotional support
- Help families navigate through the system(s)
- Help family members understand all possible options and make informed decisions
- Promote productive partnerships between parents and professionals

Practice Principles

How we work

- Peer support is voluntary
- Peer supporters are hopeful
- Peer supporters are open minded
- Peer supporters are empathetic
- Peer supporters are respectful

- Peer supporters facilitate change
- Peer supporters are honest and direct
- Peer support is mutual and reciprocal
- Peer support is equally shared power
- Peer support is strengths-focused

Ethical Principles

What are ethics?

Avoid doing harm to others

Honesty - hopeful but honest with parents and colleagues, eg confidentiality has limits

Transparency- clarity about role, eg you are a peer not a friend,

Reliability - do what you say you will do, don't make promises you can't keep, be at work on time & for the time focus on the work

Empathy - Listen to others' stories without judgement

Self-Care – be proactive in taking care of yourself

Confidentiality – respect confidentiality

Report any concerns that someone might be at risk of harm to project coordinator immediately

Report any conflict of Interest issues immediately eg you know parents from previous interactions – ask the other parent partner to meet with them

Avoid being involved in drama or conflict – leave the space, protect yourself, call Lyn

You are a mandatory reporter

- By law you need to report risk of significant harm – discuss with Lyn as the first step
- This includes parents you meet, or a parent partner (or other colleague)

Confidentiality

Confidentiality

- Do not discuss any of the conversations with parents, other peers or anything that happens in the Court. with anyone apart from project team staff, unless otherwise directed
- Do not post on Social Media any information or photos from the project, or about any family you meet from the project
- Do not voice record conversations with parents
- Do not keep written records
- Do not provide parents or family you meet at the Court or in the workshops with your personal phone number or contact details. Use the project email as primary way parents can contact you.
- Do not participate in confidential discussions such as with the lawyer
